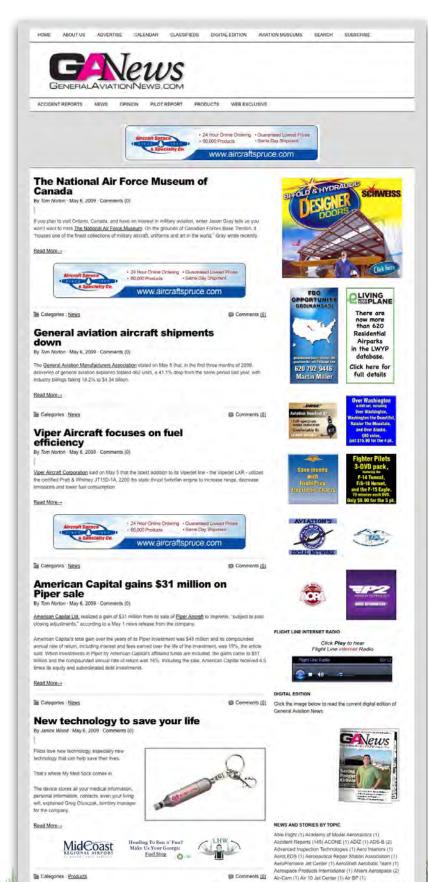

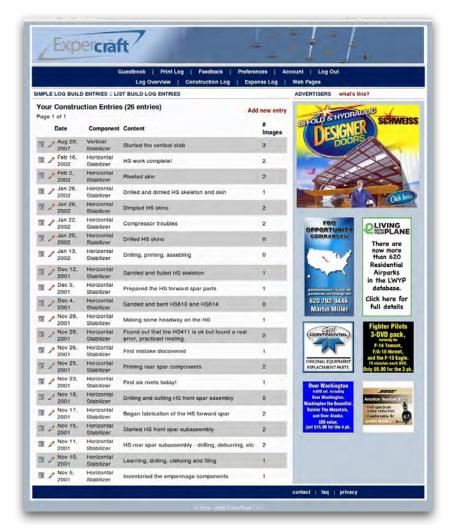

Piper Aircraft's most recent owner, American Capital, has sold its entire stake in the iconic, 72-year old company to Imprimis, a corporate finance and investment management firm operating from offices in Bangkok, Singapore and Brunei Darussalam, Piper announced on May 1. The new owners have pledged to keep Piper's headquarters, production and product development facilities at Vero Beach.

American Capital acquired the majority of Piper by assuming \$57 million of senior debt discounted to \$34 million in July of 2003. The company did not disclose how much Imprimis paid.

WASP seek support for Congressional Gold Medal May 04, 2009 10:56 am | Tom Norton

The Women Airforce Service Pilots, the legendary WASP, are the subject of a Senate bill that would award them a Congressional Gold Medal for their service during World War II. The surviving WASP, now in their 80s, are asking for support from the public to get the bill passed.

The intent of the WASP program was to free up male combat pilots from duties such as aircraft ferrying and flight instruction during the war but, ultimately, it "served as a catalyst for revolutionary reform in the integration of women pilots into the Armed Services," according to the bill's author, Sen. Kay Bailey Hutchison (R-Tex.).

Aviation industry suffering in Kansas May 04, 2009 10:31 am | Tom Norton

The aviation manufacturing industry in Kansas has been hit hard by the recession but, at least so far, employment hasn't fallen to the levels it reached after the 2001 terrorist attacks, according to a May 3 Forbes.com report.

Aviation manufacturing employment has declined by about 20% since November of 2008, the report said, while in 2001 aviation employment. dropped 35% over the three years that followed. Whether current employment will slip that much is uncertain, mostly because the downturn is still in its early stages, the report said.
